90-minute train tour. Starting location: Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (PAFA), Hamilton Building, 128 N. Broad Street, Philadelphia

Experience the power of murals by train. This special tour on Philadelphia's Market-Frankford elevated train line takes you through *Love Letter*, by noted street artist Steve ESPO Powers. In 2010, Powers collaborated with the West Philadelphia community to create *Love Letter* a public art project consisting of a series of 50 rooftop murals from 45th to 63rd streets along the Market Street corridor in West Philadelphia that reference

the city's history of painted building ads, with a twist: each mural is an open-ended love letter, from an artist to his hometown, from an individual to a neighborhood, from one lover to another. Hear the stories behind these murals on this exciting and unique tour from a professionally trained guide. The tour begins at PAFA with a short walk to the train. There are several stops along the ride to spot murals and a platform switch which is only accessibly by several



flights of stairs; appropriate outdoor weather attire is strongly suggested.

The *Love Letter* Tours continue to be offered through Memorial Day: Saturdays, 10:30 AM – Noon and Sundays, 1-2:30 PM. Tickets are \$23 per person (includes a SEPTA token). SEPTA pass holders will receive a \$2 discount on *Love Letter* tours by using the discount code SEPTA (advanced ticket sales only).
