JUNE 24: PHILADELPHIA ORCHESTRA MUSIC DIRECTOR YANNICK NÉZET-SÉGUIN TO MAKE MANN HISTORY WITH CONDUCTING DEBUT FOR 2019 GALA

The Philadelphia Orchestra will perform Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with the debut of Maestro Yannick Nézet-Séguin accompanied by fireworks at the Mann's Party in the Park Gala;

Mann honors 20-year veteran Nancy Newman who enters retirement

WHAT:

Yannick Nézet-Séguin, Music Director of The Philadelphia Orchestra, is making his conducting debut at the Mann for a special gala concert featuring Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. The Philadelphia Orchestra will perform under fireworks for an unforgettable evening at the Mann's recent \$11 million renovated campus. The concert will be the centerpiece of the Mann's 2019 Party in the Park gala, an annual fundraiser benefiting the Mann's education and community engagement programs, which serve more than 30,000 young people annually.

The first half of this momentous evening, co-presented by the Mann and NEWorks Productions, will feature the Philadelphia Community Mass, a concert-theatrical experience that explores the relevance of faith in our times inspired by Leonard Bernstein's MASS and conceived and conducted by Nolan Williams, Jr., the Mann's Festival Artistic Director. Other featured groups include the Philadelphia Youth Orchestra and Philadelphia Symphonic Choir.

In the second half, Maestro Nézet-Séguin will conduct the "Fabulous Philadelphians," in addition to an internationally acclaimed group of soloists from the Metropolitan Opera, performing the world-renowned Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, one of the towering masterworks of classical music. Not since the era of the legendary Wolfgang Sawallisch has a current Philadelphia Orchestra Music Director graced the Mann's Presser Foundation Stage.

During the evening, the Mann will also celebrate the retirement of Executive Vice President Nancy Newman. Newman has served the Mann and its patrons for 20 years and her legacy will continue through the Nancy R. Newman Endowment Fund for Landscape, Art and Music at the Mann. This fund was created to establish a permanent legacy to celebrate Newman's two decades of stewardship and commitment.
